# Profile

Head Start is a Comprehensive child development program that serves preschool children and their families. The overall goal is to increase the school readiness of young children and close the achievement gap between low– income and middle– income children.

RECAP Head Start provides services in the areas of *education, health, dental, mental health, nutrition, and family engagement.* In addition the individualized program is responsive to each child's developmental, ethnic, cultural, and linguistic heritage.

## Community Assessment



#### Our Service Area 2018-2019:

- It is estimated that there are 411 children age (0-4) and income eligible children in our service area.
- 402 Children in Orange County were in Foster Care.
- There were 3,980 reports of child abuse and neglect and 628 families were receiving preventative services.
- **5,128** families sought housing assistance and **919** were temporarily housed.

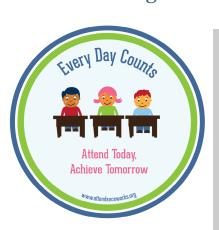

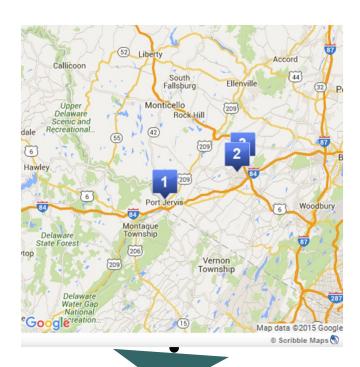


#### **Attendance**

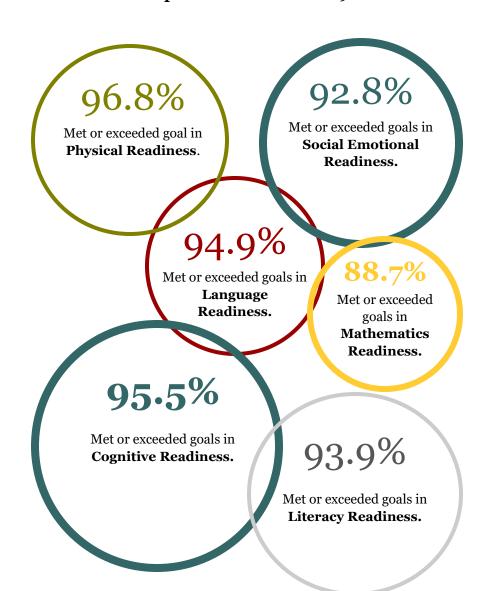

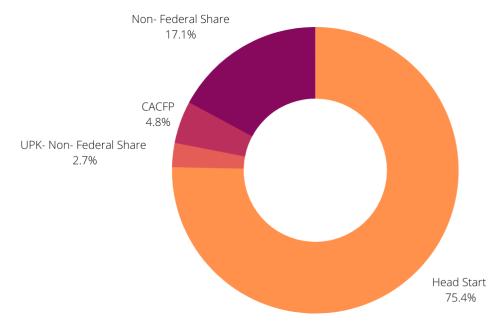

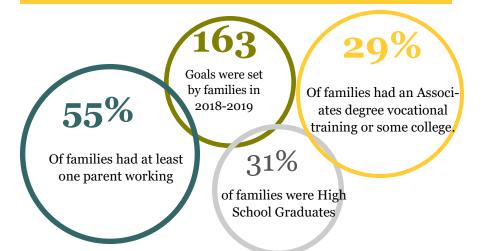
